Camp Get Fit/Kids in the Kitchen is an annual 5 day youth camp that promotes and educates our community's youth about a healthy lifestyle. Our campers attend 5 daily sessions held at the Boys & Girls Club of Lufkin, that focuses on healthy cooking, health education, and exercise.

This year, the camp looked a little different. Instead of the Junior League Members educating and exercising in person, the committee members were able to have organizations such as Changing Lives, FITT LIFE, Jenn-

ifer Winston, Six Guns Martial Arts, Dr. Kyle King, Harold's House, The Coalition, and ADAC pre-record the lessons.

With the kitchen portion, Kate Rudasill with 1921 Catering donated food and materials for the kids to enjoy creating healthy snacks. For safety reasons, the committee decided to pre-portion all the food per child.

With the members not able to be there daily, Danielle (Chair) and Carolina (Co-Chair) dropped off the materials every morning for the Boys & Girls Club, and picked up the previous day items to sanitize. On Friday, the kids were able to enjoy water balloons and receive the gift bag which included a t-shirt, water bottle and various goodies.

Even though this year was a little different, The Junior League of Lufkin still educated and exercised with 60 kids at the Boys & Girls Club. We hope next year we will be back in person with the kids, and continue to grow with the Boys & Girls Club.





he 10th annual Back to School Bonanza was held on Saturday, August 8, 2020. Despite facing new challenges because of Covid-19, our committee and community partners thrived with changes and held a successful event!

Because of Covid-19 concerns, we moved the event outside the Pitser Garrison Convention Center and held it as a drive-thru. We had over 1,200 children that were pre-registered, and we bagged their items up in the days before the event. These kids received uniforms, socks, shoes, undergarments, and other items, along with backpacks filled with school supplies. The morning of the event, parents were able to drive thru on the south side of the building (by First Baptist Church) for volunteers to put their pre-bagged items and backpacks in their cars.

For families that needed to register the morning of the event, we set up our normal stations in the north side parking lot (by Central Church of Christ). Once families were registered, they stayed in their cars and drove to each station to get the items for their children. It took a lot of set up and tear down the day of the event, but it was so wonderful to be able to still provide needed items to local students.







Because of the drive-thru style, we weren't able to offer head checks and haircuts this year. However, we were excited to be able to add some new items this year, which included feminine hygiene kits and cloth face masks for students.

We stuffed 3,000 backpacks to give away at Back to School Bonanza. We helped nearly 1,700 children the day of the event, and the leftover backpacks were distributed to area schools and organizations that can continue to hand out these supplies throughout the school year.

It was so heartwarming to see the community really come together during such a challenging year, and embrace the changes we made in order to still hold the event and provide needed items for students.

The B2SB committee, community partners, and volunteers went above and beyond to help our community, and I'm so thankful to be part of such a giving organization and community!



For more than 60 years, the women of The Junior League of Lufkin have been working to build a better community and we are excited to continue this work through our newer fundraising project, the JLL's Second Chance Rummage Sale. This Second Chance Rummage Sale serves the community directly by providing much needed items at greatly reduced prices and by donating hundreds of dollars in Second Chance Cash vouchers to other organizations such as the Women's shelter. Mosaic center. Mantooth House and Buckner Family Services just to name a few. These clients were able to redeem the Second Chance Cash vouchers for much needed merchandise at the Rummage Sale.

Poverty has remained an urgent problem within the United States and we witness it each day right here in our own backyard. With close to 20% of Angelina County residents living below the poverty level, it is critical that we strive to serve those in need. Many of our neighbors in Angelina County cannot afford basic items required for daily living such as food, clothing and shelter and others will be overlooked for employment opportunities because of these limited resources. With your support, this event transforms lives

by giving families access to low cost clothing, furniture, housewares, books and much more found at the rummage sale. These items help individuals dress for success as they seek jobs, provide their children with warm coats during the frigid winter months and provide beds to lie on at night instead of cold, hard floors. In addition to the Second Chance Cash vouchers, funds raised from the JLL Second Chance Rummage sale also support our many other league projects. Your contributions help us continue our annual Back to School Bonanza event. As you know, this year's B2SB had a total of 1,673 kids registered for backpacks (we stuffed 3,000 this year). Almost all remaining backpacks have been distributed through schools and local organizations (Casa, CPS, Buckner, etc). These children were able to start the new school year prepared to learn, giving them a chance at education and breaking the cycle of poverty.





The Second Chance Rummage Sale serves two purposes, to raise funds for the Junior League of Lufkin's community projects and to provide a much-needed service to our community. As I mentioned before many of our children in Angelina County live in poverty. Poverty affects children's mental and physical well-being, as well as their success in education and beyond. In conjunction with the Rummage Sale, the League and community members encouraged to participate in a special promotion called The Little Black Dress Initiative. What is the Little Black Dress Initiative? The Little Black Dress Initiative is



a poverty awareness fundraising campaign in which participants wear one Black dress for five consecutive days in order to illustrate the effects poverty can have on your access to resources such as food, clothing, shelter and medical care, your confidence and your employment opportunities.

Why should we care about this issue? Because it correlates with our mission and it is important to the future of the children in our community. During the campaign, participants posted pictures of themselves from day 1 to day 5 and blog via social media about how wearing the same dress (cannot wash it) makes them feel and think about what it is like to have limited resources and how this affects your confidence and self-esteem and how this causes barriers for employment etc.

They will in turn encourage friends, families and community members to donate to the JLL LBDI on our PayPal account. Following the campaign, JLL Second Chance Rummage Sale will present Second Chance Cash vouchers to local organizations to distribute to clients in need who can then redeem them at the Rummage sale for clothing, furniture or anything they may want or need.





The remainder of the funds will also go back into our Community projects such as CGF/KITK, B2SB for school supplies, backpacks, uniforms, shoes etc. and TAT sponsorships. This is a great opportunity for the Junior League of Lufkin to raise awareness about the effects of poverty on families and be able to give back to these same families in need with the Second Chance Cash vouchers. The Second Chance Rummage Sale was held at Pitser Garrison Convention Center.

The shopping took place on Friday, October 9 and Saturday, October 10.

She was a committee volunteer for the American Cancer Society and the Gala Chairperson in 2013. She has been active with her church, Harmony Hill Baptist Church and held positions of Building Committee Marketing Chair, Adult Life group Leader and Youth Life Group Leader.

She participated in the Lake Enhancement Task Force, and was Treasurer and later President of the High School Cheer Boosters, in addition to the Merrill Lynch Client Advisory

Board. She became a member of the Angelina Arts Alliance Board in 2018, was vice-chairman in 2019 and is presently Chairman. In addition, Rebecca is also a member of the Angelina College Advisory Board.

Most Junior League members are familiar with the Lufkin ISD Education Foundation. Their mission is to provide opportunities for excellence in education, promote innovation in teaching and partner with the community to achieve the quality of education for all students of the Lufkin Independent School District.

The foundation was awarded over \$250,000 in grants in the past 6 years, and sponsors the Panthers of Prestige Academic Banquet.

I believe one of this sustainers' greatest contributions is her efforts in beginning the Lufkin ISD Education Foundation - as Founding President from 2013 - 2015 and continuing on the board to 2019.

Another outstanding contribution is with Second Helpings of Angelina County. Second Helpings is a nonprofit group of volunteers in Lufkin who are seeking to fight hunger in Angelina County while reducing food waste on school campuses.

Monday-Friday, volunteers pick up unused food from a school campus and distribute this fresh food that would otherwise be disposed of by law. Of course, this sustainer was a founding member and Vice President from 2017 to present.

1/4 t. sugar


1 clove garlic, pressed
